Dear First-Year ECA Students and Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to the first installment of the ECA Welcome Newsbrief. The ECA Admin staff has returned from our summer break, and we are busily preparing for our upcoming school year! I will be writing letters throughout the remainder of the summer to provide information, answer questions, and otherwise keep in touch with

you prior to the start of the school year.

In addition to all the things you'll be doing this summer--hopefully things like relax, vacation, work a summer job, be with friends and family--this summer is also one in which you're preparing for a big transition—switching schools to come to EMU's campus for a major head start on college.

Our faculty and staff are very skilled at working with students from all levels of initial skill (I'm talking about both academic and "soft skills") to enable them to be successful in college—but I would like to encourage *every incoming student* to use a little bit of summer's time to give yourself a boost before school starts.

Research shows that reading proficiency is a significant component of college readiness—and is often under-emphasized in high school, at least to the degree required in college. *Commit to reading a minimum of 30 minutes per day this summer to build your reading skills and stamina*. In addition, our English department is recommending three specific texts that can also boost students' and family members' understanding of the "ECA Way:"

Mindset: A New Psychology of Success by Carol Dweck.

Thanks for the Feedback: The Science and Art of Receiving Feedback Well by D. Stone & S. Heen

Drive: The Surprising Truth About What Motivates Us by Daniel Pink
